
Create Your Own Bookmark!

Monster "Page Corner" Bookmark You will need: · scissors · a glue stick · colored or patterned paper · your own fun decorations Body **Face Insert Body Insert**

Directions:

- 1. Print this template.
- Cut out all pieces of the template along the solid lines.
- Trace "body" onto colored or patterned paper and cut out.
- Trace "body insert" and "head insert" onto pattered paper and then
- Glue patterned "body insert" onto the square of your body bookmark.
- Fold one triangle of body bookmark in towards the square so it covers half the square.
- 7. Apply glue to the underside (the side facing up) of the second triangle then fold it onto the first triangle to glue them together.
- Glue patterned "face insert" onto the triangle of your book mark.
- Glue straight edge of teeth to the underside of the triangle face so jagged teeth are showing.
- 10. Glue large eye circle onto the triangle face.
- 11. Trace middle eye circle onto colored or patterned paper and cut out and glue into large eye circle
- 12. Glue small black eye circle into colored middle eye circle.
- 13. Add other decorations as you see fit. i.e.; horns, hair, eyebrows, glitter etc

Now you have a monster bookmark that slips onto the corner of the page you want to mark!
