New York State Minimum Standards Revision Requires That All Public Libraries:


 ✓ Have a "community-based, board approved, written long range plan of service developed by the library board of trustees and staff" (Standard # 2)

✓ Objective: By January 2021, The Tobacco Coalition Program will reduce the use of tobacco in youth and adults in the County by 10% through the Tobacco Awareness/Cessation Program

Case Study – Guernsey Memorial Library

 ✓ The library hosted a series of focus groups with a wide variety of community partners
 ✓ Then built a plan based on the issues that arose in the discussions

Case Study – Red Hook Public Library

- ✓ Went door to door asking how people felt about the community
- \checkmark Helped resolve a situation with the stoplight
- ✓ Gained community partners and built momentum

Case Study – Southern Adirondack Library System (SALS)

✓ SALS and 4 member libraries identified food insecurity as a community issue

 ✓ Partnered with food banks to use libraries as food distribution points

 Addresses food scarcity & nutrition issues while bringing new people into the library

Beyond Surveys – Community Interviews

✓ Brainstorm Community Leaders

- ✓ Call up and make an appointment (in their space)
- ✓ Conduct the Interview (in pairs if possible)
- ✓ Staff Analysis look for themes
- ✓ Community Conversation invite interviewees back to hear results
- \checkmark Use themes to develop long range plan

Beyond Surveys – Focus Groups

✓ Brainstorm Community Leaders

- \checkmark Invite to Focus Group(s)
- \checkmark Conduct the Focus Group(s)
- \checkmark Staff Analysis look for themes
- ✓ Community Conversation invite interviewees back to hear results
- \checkmark Use themes to develop long range plan

Walker Public Library

✓ Serves a community of 42,461 people in Western NY

- \checkmark Broaden outreach and develop partnerships
- \checkmark Offer program with a wide range of educational, cultural, and social experiences
- \checkmark Develop a brand strategy to better tell the library story
- ✓ Enhance user experience by providing exemplary customer service

Alextown Public Library

✓ Serves a community of 3,528 people in rural northern NY

- \checkmark Raise the profile of the library

Miller Gorge Public Library
